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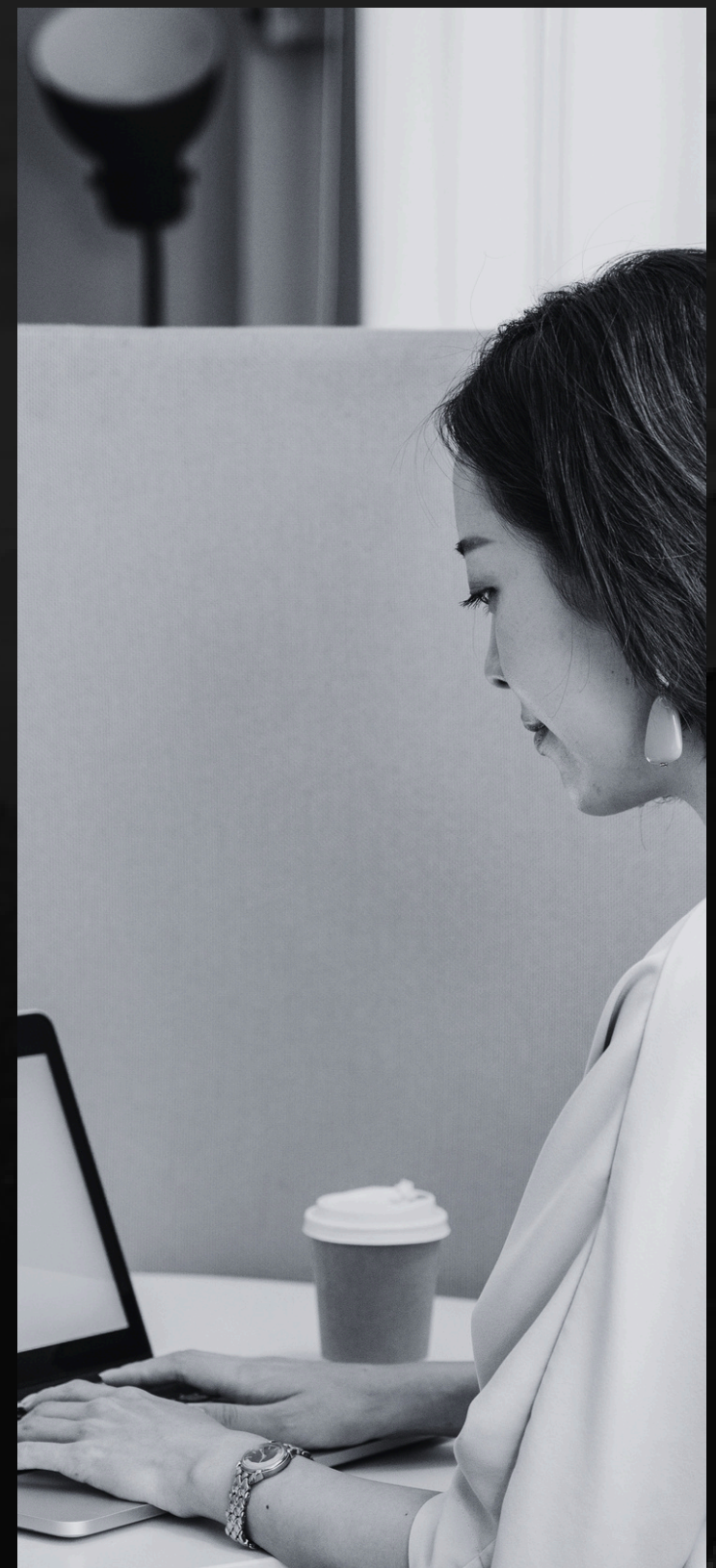

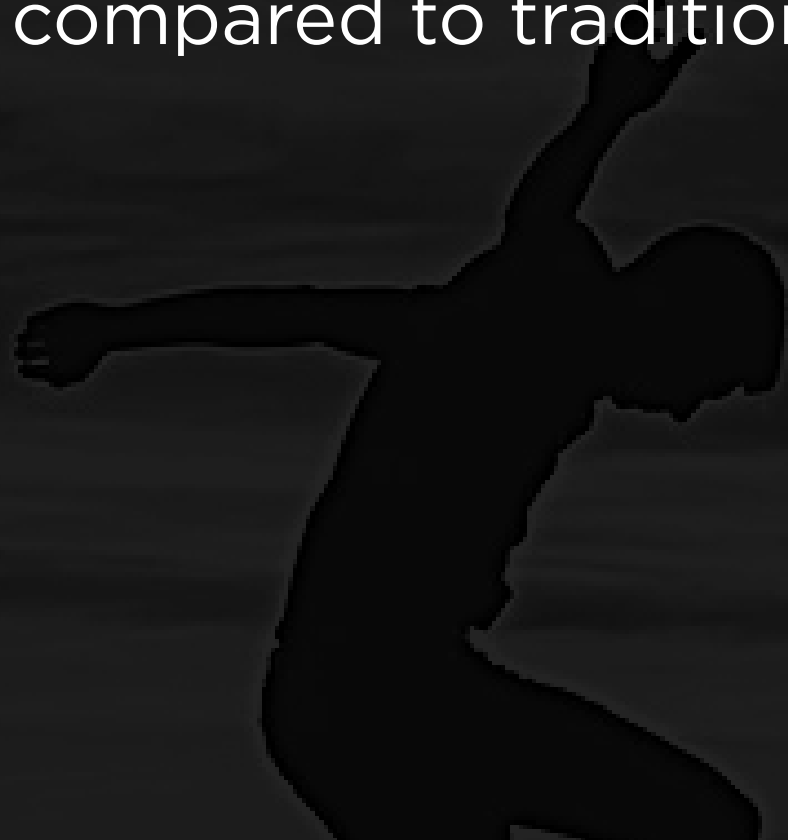

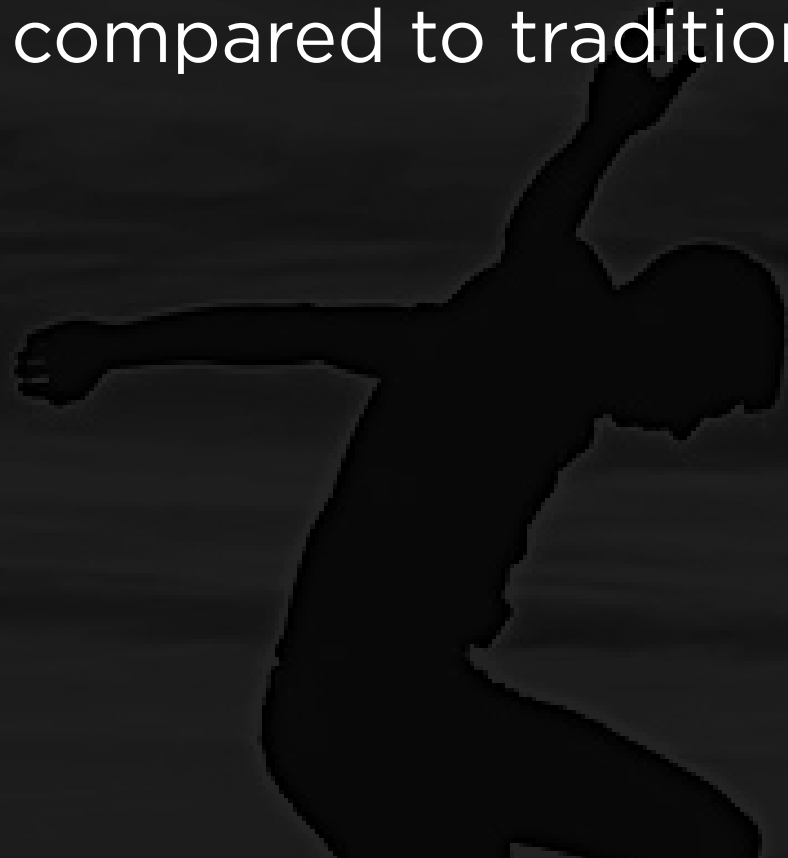

MULTIMEDIA IN ELEARNING



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DIALOGUE SIMULATIONS

Interactive role-playing activities that imitate conversations with customers, colleagues, or other individuals to develop communication and interpersonal skills.

SOFTWARE SIMULATIONS

These allow learners to practice using software applications by demonstrating features, navigation, and operations in a safe environment before working with the actual software.

BEHAVIORAL SIMULATIONS

Behavioral simulations recreate workplace situations where learners practice leadership, teamwork, customer service, or conflict resolution without real-world consequences.

LEVELS OF INTERACTIVE SIMULATIONS

Interactive simulations can also vary in complexity:

- **Screen Capture** – Demonstrates simple processes such as logging into a system.
- **Point and Click** – Allows learners to interact with menus and simple interface elements.
- **Data Input** – Requires learners to enter information while practicing software skills.
- **Multiple Input Paths** – Offers different routes for completing tasks, promoting deeper understanding.
- **Full Simulation** – Provides access to the complete software environment for comprehensive practice.
